Built in c. 1856 by San Jacinto veteran and furniture maker William Winters, the Winters-Wimberley House is the village's oldest documented stone cottage and the anchor of Wimberley's economic origin: the miller and his mill. Winters used thick hand-cut limestone walls in a single gable style. After Winters' death in 1864, successive resident millers were John Cude, Pleasant Wimberley and John Pyland. This dwelling with its several additions was purchased for community use in 1997. It had been continuously occupied as a residence for 140 years. It received an Official Texas Historic Subject Marker in 1999 and was listed in the National Register of Historic Places in 2002.

The Wimberley Institute of Cultures (WIC) operates and cares for the house as part of its mission to sustain and present the history and cultural experiences of our area.

Capacity: Up to 100 inside, depending on the nature of the event

 Back room with built-in wet bar
 ADA approved restroom inside and outside in the archive building
 Fully equipped kitchen suitable for heating and serving but not for initial food preparation
 Stocked pantry
 Central heat and air-conditioning
 Patio and exterior lighting for outdoor events
 Handicapped parking

Fee Schedule:

Your reservation must include set-up and clean-up time, which may require time on the day before and/or after your event.

Security deposit is \$200.00. Your deposit check will be returned to you or destroyed unless a cleaning crew must be hired or repairs made after your event. The House and grounds must be returned to the same condition as it was delivered.

Events booked by a WIC member or a charitable or civic organization:

- Up to 3 hours: \$50.00
- Additional hours, same day: \$10.00 per hour
- One day: \$75.00

Events booked by a non-WIC member:

- Up to 3 hours: \$75.00
- Additional hours, same day: \$20.00 per hour
- One day: \$100.00
